What is Lent?

Lent, the solemn 40-day period before Easter, holds profound significance in the Catholic Church and other Christian traditions. Starting on Ash Wednesday, this year on Wednesday 14th February 2024, and concluding on Holy Thursday, it is a season of penitence and preparation. Throughout Lent Catholics engage in the spiritual disciplines of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. These practices serve to deepen our connection with God, our awareness of Jesus' sacrificial love, and to prepare our hearts and minds for the Paschal Mystery-the journey of Jesus' passion, death, and resurrection. Lent is an invitation to reflect, repent, and renew one's commitment to living a life of faith, ultimately leading to the joyful celebration of Easter. There are many ways to live our Catholic faith during the Lenten season! Many people make personal sacrifices and give something up for the entire forty-day period, symbolising self-discipline, and reliance on God's grace. Some engage in acts of service to emulate Jesus' love and compassion towards others. And there are many practices and traditions that take place at our Parish Church! The Stations of the Cross is a revered tradition where Catholics pray and reflect on the journey of Jesus' Passion and death. This year our Stations of the Cross will be on the Tuesdays of Lent before the beginning of Mass and will be an opportunity to pray for good and holy vocations from our Diocese. We will also receive this Lent a small card with a simple morning and evening prayer that we can pray every day during Lent. The cards will be distributed on Ash Wednesday and on the First Sunday of Lent.



Our "Lenten Retreat" this Year

Our "Lenten Retreat" this year will be the theme of the Cross - "The Sign of the Cross". Lent is a time where the Good Lord wants to transform our love and invites us to unite our crosses with his. We will consider, on the Sundays of Lent, the Cross from the perspective of different symbols - the Cross as an altar, a mirror, a banner, and then a book.

Ash Wednesday

Ash Wednesday is one of the most popular and important holy days in the liturgical calendar. Ash Wednesday opens Lent, a season of fasting and prayer. It comes from the ancient Jewish tradition of penance and fasting. The practice includes the wearing of ashes on the head. The ashes symbolise the dust from which God made us. As the priest applies the ashes to a person's forehead, he speaks the words: "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return." Ashes also symbolise grief, in this case, grief that we have sinned and caused division from God. The ashes are made from blessed palm branches, taken from the previous year's Palm Sunday Mass. It is important to remember that Ash Wednesday is a day of penitential prayer and fasting. Some faithful take the rest of the day off work and remain home. It is generally inappropriate to dine out, to shop, or to go about in public after receiving the ashes. Feasting is highly inappropriate. Small children, the elderly and sick are exempt from this observance.

Lenten Penance Service in the Three Towns

We've heard the phrase, "What would Jesus do?" As we start the season of Lent, a better question is, "What did Jesus do?" Jesus, about to transition from the hidden mission of home to the public mission of proclaiming the Good News of God 's love, was drawn to pray and fast for 40 days in the desert. The desert. Why would Jesus go there - on purpose? Though preparing for a big lifechange, his instinct wasn't to busy himself. It was to retreat. To guiet himself. To listen. To allow himself to be tested in his core. To encounter the Father and let his heart be focused, nourished, and shaped for his mission. We are invited to metaphorically enter the desert each Lent. But how do we enter the "desert"? We have three Lenten Penance Services in the Three Towns this Lent:

Monday, 18th March at 2pm at St Mary's Saltcoats, Tuesday, 19th March at 7pm at St John's Stevenston, and Wednesday, 20th March at 7pm at St Peter in Chains Ardrossan.

Though going into the desert implies some discomfort. . . go for it. Embrace it. It is purposeful. It is the Lord we seek. . . and the truth about ourselves... so that God can heal what is broken. So... live this Lent.
