Jesus wants us to live each day of our lives to the full, loving God and loving our neighbour. That's why he doesn't tell us exactly when the end of history will come, just as he doesn't tell us exactly when our own death will come.

It is enough for us to know that it could be today. Every time we hear an ambulance siren, we are reminded that the world might have come to an end for someone. Every time we drive past a cemetery, it is an opportunity for us to take stock of our lives, to change whatever needs to be changed so that we can die with no regrets. Some people consider these thoughts morbid, but they are just realistic. The really morbid thought is to blind ourselves to what Jesus has revealed and pretend that history will never end. A painting by the remarkable nineteenth century British artist Sir John Everett Millais captures the lesson our Lord is trying to teach us. It is called The Vale of Rest and it is held by the Tate Gallery in London. It refers to an old Scottish superstition that when a coffin-shaped cloud is seen in the sky, it means an approaching death. The painting shows the cemetery of a convent, with a few crooked old headstones. In the background the sun is setting, and the tall trees growing near the convent wall are sharply, blackly silhouetted. One dark cloud blotches the brilliant sunset, and it is in the shape of a coffin. In the foreground are two nuns. The younger nun is knee-deep in a grave, digging vigorously, her veil tucked back out of the way she is working hard, serving her neighbour. Sitting on a headstone beside her is an older nun, holding a rosary – praying hard, serving the Lord. The sitting nun is staring right out of the canvas, directly at the onlooker. Her face is hard to read, but it seems to be anxious and intent. She has seen the coffin-shaped cloud, and she seems to know who the grave is for: maybe for her, maybe for a dying sister in the convent, but also maybe for the intruder on the scene – us. We do not know the day or the hour, but we know the fact: Jesus will come again; history will end; the sun will set, and God wants us to stay ready, both by working and by praying.

Latest Updates from the Synod in Rome

The Synod on Synodality's first session at the Vatican has concluded, with its results wrapped up in a 41-page "halftime report". Here are a few "takeaways" for us to think and pray about. 1. Synodality is about the church's evangelising mission. "Synodality is ordered to mission," because we all share the "common grace of baptism." 2. The Synod calls for formation in "authentic discipleship," united by the Eucharist and nourished by the Word of God. We all have the "responsibility of demonstrating and transmitting the love and tenderness of God to a wounded humanity." Living discipleship is at the heart of being Catholic. "The Eucharist shapes synodality," and so the Mass should be celebrated "with an authentic sense of friendship in Christ" that reflects beauty and simplicity. Every Community should find ways of enriching our Catholic life beyond the Mass with alternative forms of liturgical prayer, as well as popular piety, particularly Marian devotion. 3. Synodality is about discerning together how to go on mission at each level of the church. The document emphasises the need for formation, and also making spaces to receive the church's teaching, and discern how to act on it. The church's social doctrine needs to be understood by the faithful so they can build up the kingdom of God. "Jesus' actions, assimilated in prayer and conversion of heart, show us the way forward." The Synod recognised there is universal agreement that priestly celibacy is "richly prophetic and a profound witness to Christ." 4. Disciples listen to people and accompany them like Christ. The Synod emphasised the church needs to give its closeness, listening and accompaniment to those who feel alone in remaining faithful to the church's teaching on marriage and sexual ethics, as well as to those on the margins because of "their marriage status, identity or sexuality." The synod suggests further consideration of the point that listening "does not mean compromising proclamation of the Gospel or endorsing any opinion or position proposed" -but rather being like Jesus, who listens and loves unconditionally to share his good news. 5. The Synod emphasises the church needs to evangelise the social media as a dimension of its mission. The Synod proposes discernment on how the church can be involved in helping make the online world "safe" for families -noting the dangers of intimidation, disinformation, sex exploitation and addiction -- and how the church can make the digital realm "spiritually life-giving." 6. Sex abuse is undermining the church's missionary life, - a truly synodal church needs to get this right. Listening to and accompanying those who have suffered abuse in the church have helped people feel no longer invisible. At the same time, the Synod makes clear "the long journey towards reconciliation and justice" remains and requires "addressing the structural conditions that abetted such abuse" and "concrete gestures of penitence." A synodal church requires a "culture of transparency". These are just a few "takeaways" to consider.

Meteorologically it tells me that we will have a beautiful day tomorrow. What does it tell you, Holmes?" Holmes retorts, "It tells me that someone stole our tent!"
