### **St Almachius Beats the Gladiators**

This is one of the great differences between Christian saints and the wise spiritual heroes of other religions: the saints learn to be close to God, but they also learn to constantly go out of their way to serve their neighbours. One surprising example is the case of St Almachius. He lived in Palestine around the year 400. From an early age he felt called to love God wholeheartedly by following a life of prayer and penance. For many years he lived as a hermit in the desert wastelands, doing just that. Eventually, however, the Holy Spirit entrusted him with a surprising mission to his neighbours. Even though Christianity by this time was the Roman Empire's official religion, the infamous and very pagan gladiatorial combats were still regularly held in the Roman coliseum The Romans loved those "sporting events," which inevitably resulted in unjust, bloody, and cruel deaths for valiant men. Many gladiators were prisoners or slaves being forced to entertain the crowds by their gruesome combat, as if they were no better than savage beasts.

It was a frontal assault against the human dignity of these men who had been created in God's image and redeemed by Christ. Driven by the Holy Spirit, Almachius made his way to Rome when one such event was in full swing. He entered the amphitheatre, climbed down to the arena floor, and interposed himself between the primary combatants, who were engaged in their death struggle. This scrawny hermit did his best to separate



them, invoking the name of the Lord. The fans, thirsty for blood, were furious. They hurled every manner of projectile at the unprotected monk, stoning him to death. Fortunately, the Emperor heard about the affair and took it as a sign from God. From then on, such games were forbidden; Christian love had been victorious.

### **♣** A Secret Weapon for Christ-like Love

In today's world, people are very busy. Sometimes we even feel much too busy to take time to reach out to neighbours in need. It is very possible, however, that at the end of our life we will see things quite differently. But even in the midst of our busy-ness, we can make an effort to love God by loving our neighbour, precisely in the way we interact with the people around us. A true Christian should always remember that people matter more than things. We should never be too busy for a kind word or a sincere smile. But those of us who really are super-busy can also make use of a secret weapon that allows us to do more in less time, to fulfil both of Christ's two great commandments in one action. And it doesn't add anything at all to our to-do list or calendar. What is this secret weapon? Praying for other people. When we pray for people we are exercising both loves at the same time: we show our love for God by talking to him and expressing confidence in his goodness and power, and we show our love for our neighbour by caring about them.

### ALL SAINTS DAY ON WEDNESDAY, 1ST NOVEMBER

All Saints Day, on Wednesday, 1st November is a Holy Day of Obligation. Our Masses are at 10am and also at 7pm. Looking to the saints reminds us that in the end Christ is always victorious, that the "gates of hell" cannot resist the power of God's grace. The origins of today's liturgical celebration are a striking example of that truth. The Church began celebrating this Solemnity in Rome, in the year 609, under Pope Boniface IV. At that time, one of the older residential areas of the city was located near a huge Roman temple called the Pantheon. The Pantheon had been built four centuries earlier by the emperor-architect Hadrian. It had held huge statues of all the gods most revered by the imperial family (thus its name, "pan-theon", "all the gods"). Between the time of the emperor Hadrian and that of Pope Boniface, the Roman Empire had become Christian, and the Pantheon had been abandoned. But by the year 600 it was becoming the object of frequent complaints from those who lived in its neighbourhood. When they walked by the old temple, strange things would happen. Eerie voices would threaten them; bricks would fall down menacingly; ice-cold breezes would accost them, along with worse things than mere breezes. In short, it was clear that the place was haunted by demons. Around the year 609, the complaints reached new heights, and the neighbourhood appealed directly to the Pope to do something about it. Razing the massive structure to the ground was too gargantuan a task, so Boniface IV found a creative solution. He decided to exorcise the temple and re-consecrate it as a Christian Church, dedicated not to "all the gods" but to "all the Roman martyrs" and to Mary, the queen of all saints and martyrs. This he did, and soon after, the complaints stopped. It still serves as a church today. The memorial of that consecration became so popular that Pope Gregory III extended its celebration to the whole Church. Thus "All Saints' Day" was born - an everlasting reminder that the powers of evil are no match for the power of Christ.

### ALL SOULS DAY ON THURSDAY, 2ND NOVEMBER

Thursday, 2nd November is the Commemoration of all the Faithful Departed. We will read out the names of Parishioners who have died in the past year. How do you pray for the departed soul? Throughout the year, we can have Masses said for the souls in Purgatory, include them in our daily prayers and Rosary intentions, and pray for them when we're near a cemetery. "Every time you pass a cemetery, it's time for a little prayer: 'Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord.' It's just common sense that you help some of them get out of Purgatory." Venerable Fulton Sheen said, "As we enter Heaven, we will see them, so many of them, coming towards us and thanking us. We will ask who they are, and they will say 'a poor soul you prayed for in Purgatory."
