† Finding a Home at Christmas

In fact, it really is the little things that make a home. Sometimes you find families who forget about this. They have all the big things – a two-car garage, a home film theatre, a garden the size of a football pitch – but they are distant from each other; something essential is missing. There is a powerful story about a family from the south that was struggling to survive during a time of great uncertainty and worry. The father lost his job, and they moved to the city to find work. They couldn't afford to buy their own house, so they lived in the basement of someone else's house, paying a large rent for the tiny space. It was not the most comfortable situation – mum, dad, and five children cramped into a mouldy basement. But they made the best of it by pouring as much love as they could into the little things. They kept the place neat and clean. They had their small and sparse meals together every day. They said their prayers each morning and evening as a family. And whenever they could, they even pitched in to help other families who were in even more difficult situations. One day, one of the children's teachers came by to visit the family. She was shocked at the cramped quarters and the poverty in which the family was forced to live. The next day at school the teacher took the little girl aside and tried to comfort her. She said, "I am so sorry that you don't even have a home to live in!" But the little girl was surprised and answered, "Oh no! We have a wonderful home; we're just still looking for a house to put it in!" It's the little things in life that can make the biggest difference.

Morning Prayer - a New Year's Resolution?

As we approach the end of the year, it is a great time to consider what resolutions we can make to improve our spiritual lives in 2024. It is helpful to set aside small periods of time throughout the day for prayer, so that a rhythm of praising and listening to the voice of God is created. On the Tuesdays of Advent and Christmas Time we have we praying together before Mass the Morning prayer of the Church. Here are 7 Reasons why we should pray the Liturgy of the Hours in 2024:

1. It unites us to Jesus Christ. As Vatican II taught, the Liturgy of the Hours "is the very prayer which Christ Himself, together with His body, addresses to the Father." 2. The Liturgy of the Hours allows you to pray with the Church by joining clergy and laity from every people and nation as well as the entire communion of saints in heaven into one single prayer to God. 3. The Liturgy of the Hours is the highest form of prayer after the Mass. It is the unified, sacred prayer of the whole Church, uniting all the faithful in echoing the very Word of God back to the Father. 4. The Liturgy of the Hours is thoroughly biblical, focusing especially on the Psalms, as well as drawing from the rest of Sacred Scripture. 5. The Liturgy of the Hours will mature and deepen the rest of your spiritual life. After praying the Hours for some time, you will begin to see the world differently with a renewed spiritual vision, seeing the world as God sees it—and are changed as a result. 6. The Liturgy of the Hours allows you to "pray without ceasing" by allowing you to lock in times of prayer throughout the day. At every moment, someone somewhere is offering these prayers to God. So, while we might not be able to pray continually as individuals, we can do so together as a Church. 7. The Liturgy of the Hours makes God the centre of your day. When you pray the Liturgy of the Hours, prayer becomes the new hinge of your day, reorienting your mind so that you give highest priority to the things of God. This is a very powerful way of enriching our spiritual life in the new year with the Liturgy of the Hours.

End of the Christmas Season

On Monday 8th January 2024 we celebrate the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. Then on Tuesday, Ordinary Time begins with the unfolding of the mystery of Christ in all its aspects. Green is the colour of the season.




